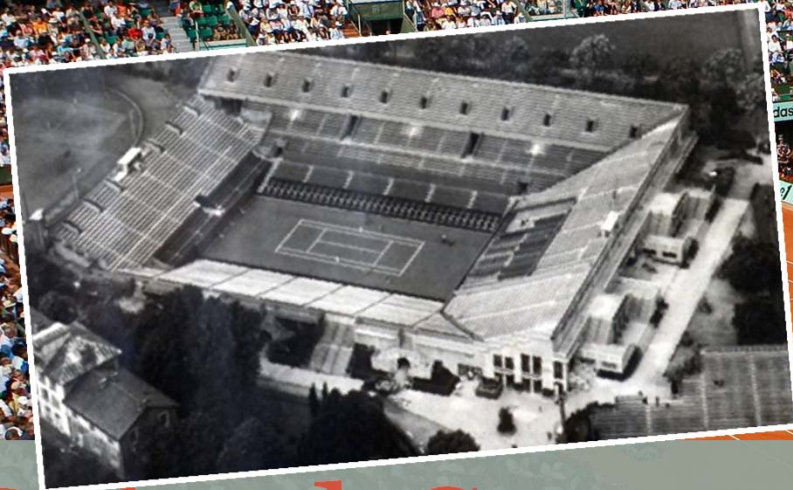
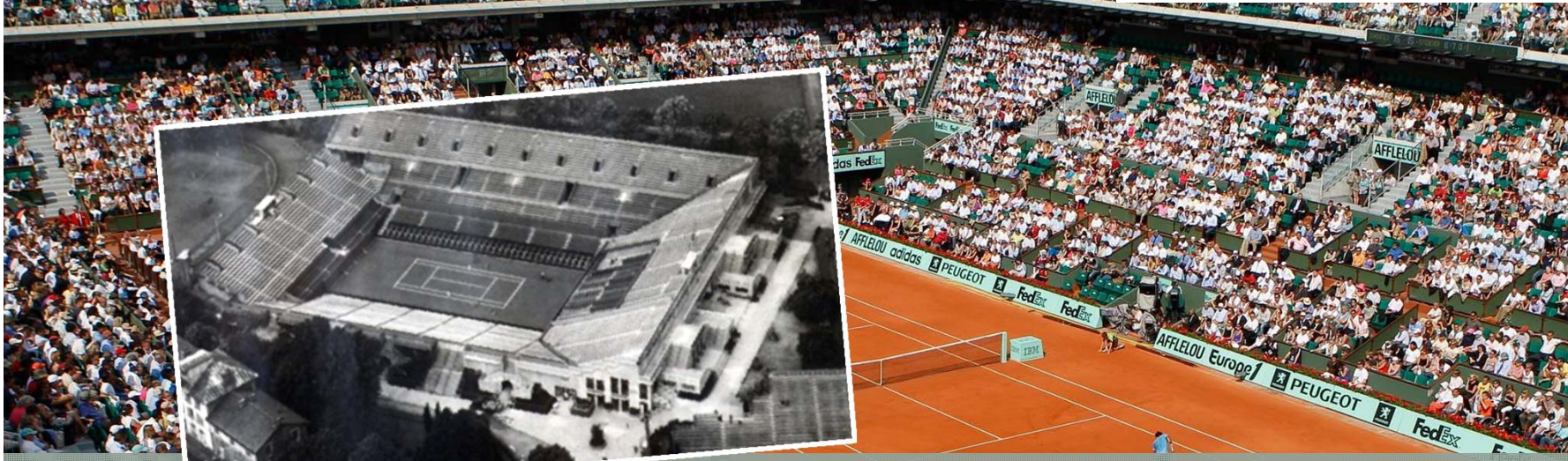

Roland-Garros

Roland-Garros is a never-ending story. The stadium that stages one of the four Majors was built in 1928. Today, the "French" fully deserves its reputation as the world's premier clay court event.



Roland-Garros History



- 1927: The celebrated French Musketeers won the Davis Cup on American soil, and in doing so set up a rematch in Paris a year later. Such a major sporting occasion required a stadium worthy of its stature, and so the Stade Français handed over three hectares of land near Porte d'Auteuil to the French Tennis Federation.
- 1928: The inauguration of the stadium. Before this, French Internationals had been staged alternately at Stade Français and Racing Club de France since 1891.
- 1968: The French Internationals becomes the first Grand Slam tournament to join the "Open" era. Professionalism brought with it yet more expansion and excitement.
- Today: The tournament fully deserves its reputation as the world's premier clay court event. Every year it is furiously competitive, drawing the best players from across the world. In fact, since the war, the only French success has been Nelly Landry (1948), Françoise Durr (1967) and Mary Pierce (2000) among the women, together with Marcel Bernard (1946) and Yannick Noah (1983) in the men's event.
- Most of the current clay court specialists are either Argentinian or Spanish, including the current champion, Majorcan left-hander Rafael Nadal ... the only man in French Open history to win each of the four tournaments he has entered

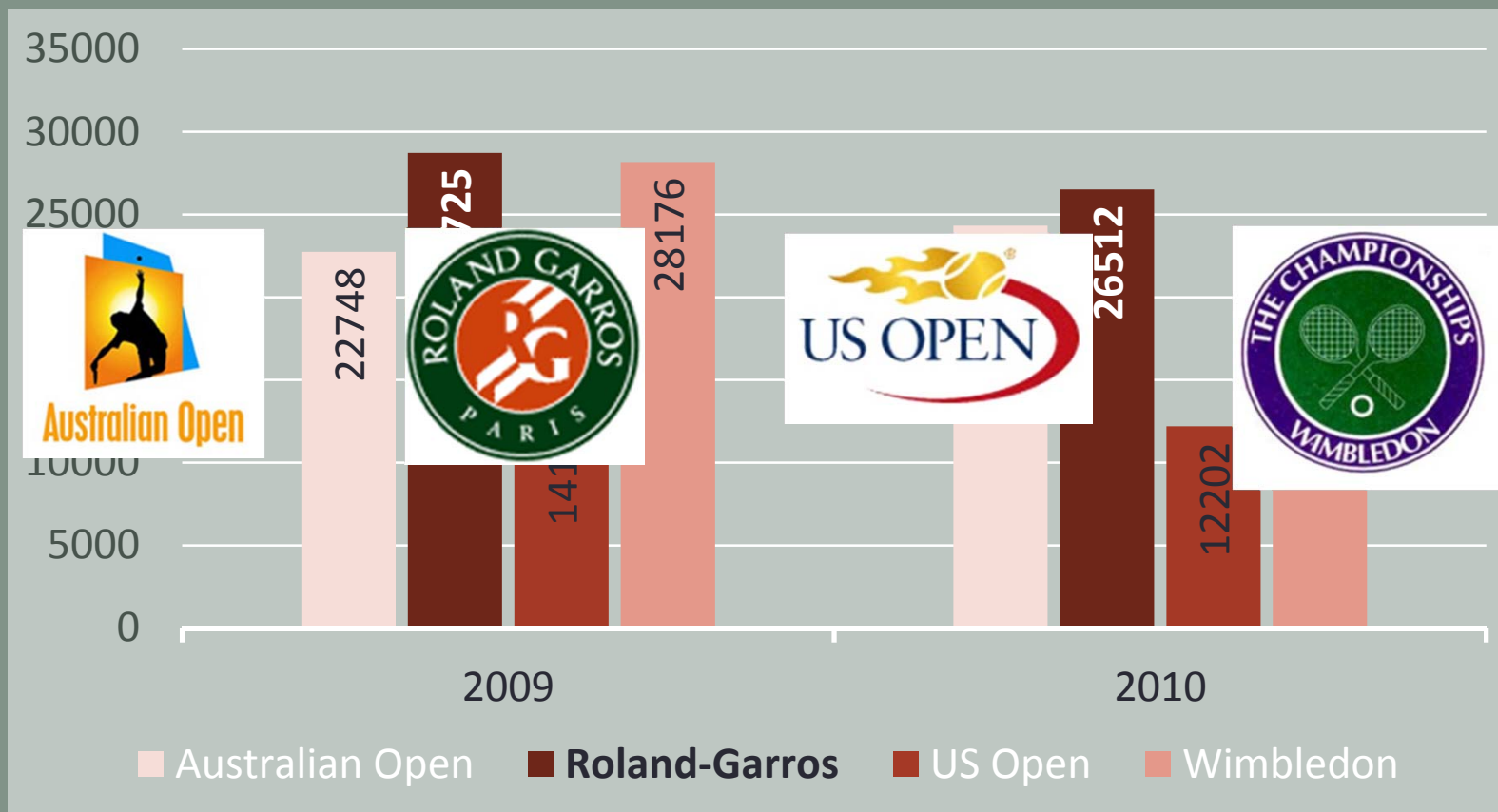
